Taking precautions for a disaster-free holiday!

TREE SAFETY

Here are some Christmas tree fire safety tips so you can avoid a similar event like Clark Griswold's doomed tree in National Lampoon's Christmas Vacation.

- Ask the tree vendor to cut off about 2" of the trunk to expose fresh wood for better water absorption.
- Don't let your pets (Snot) drink the water from the tree stand to avoid the tree drying out.
- Keep your tree at least three feet away from radiators or fireplaces (and Uncle Lewis).
- Check to be sure that your artificial tree is labeled "fire resistant."
- Be sure you have properly secured your tree.
